BACKGROUND

- Federal grant opportunity through HUD
- Metro Denver Continuum of Care, collaborative applicant
- Goal to support selected communities in the development and implementation of a coordinated community approach to preventing and ending youth homelessness
- Population youth experiencing homelessness, aged 24 and under, including unaccompanied youth and pregnant or parenting youth who are experiencing homelessness
- Up to \$15 million in federal funding
 - Estimated Start Date: 10/03/2024
 - Estimated End Date: 10/05/2026
 - 24-month grant term, option to extend 6 months
 - May be renewed for 1 year under CoC Program

Grant **Renewal** through annual CoC Program



ELIGIBLE PROJECTS

- Planning Grants (up to 10%)
- Permanent Housing (PSH and RRH)
- Transitional Housing (including Crisis Residential TH)
- Joint TH and PH-RRH
- HMIS (Homeless Management Information System)
- Supportive Service Only (SSO), including but not limited to coordinated entry, housing search and placement services, case management, drop-in centers, legal services, or street outreach
- Host Homes & Kinship Care
- Shared Housing


IMPROVEMENTS

- 6 weeks of planning before HUD notice
- 4 winning applications, 3 meetings with applicants
- Deep dive into opportunities for growth
 - Clear strategic priorities or project lead
 - More cross-sector collaboration
 - Didn't seem ready to take on the funding
 - Youth-involvement front and center
 - Didn't have a needs assessment
- Needs Assessment (State of Youth Homelessness)



NEEDS ASSESSMENT

- 1. TOTALS The number of youth, both sheltered and unsheltered, experiencing and at-risk of homelessness.
 - a. HMIS
 - b. PIT,
 - c. TAY-VISPDAT
 - d. OneHome Enrollment
 - e. RHY Intake/Exit
 - f. McKinney Vento
- 2. DISPARITIES A description of disparities identified through the assessment, quantitative and qualitative.
 - a. Race, LBGTQIA+, Systems Involvement (Criminal Justice, Foster Care), Health (Mental Health, Substance Use, HIV/AIDS)
- 3. KEY FINDINGS Barriers/Needs
 - a. Listening space, surveys, assessment data
- 4. YOUTH INVOLVEMENT How youth were involved in designing or executing the needs assessment
