Per the bylaws amended in 2009, new Board Members are recommended by a Nominating Committee and voted on by the Board. This process assures a balanced Board in terms of category, geographical location, and skill set. The Board can now be comprised of up to 30 voting members; 10 members representing government organizations, 10 representing nonprofits serving homeless or at risk of homelessness & 10 independent members including homeless &/or formerly homeless, businesses, foundations, faith-based groups, & neighborhood associations. The Board of Directors shall represent constituencies from each of the 7 counties in MDHI. Also, a Community Advisory Board made up of homeless or formerly homeless provides feedback and suggestions to Board.

MDHI now writes the SuperNOFA & provides project oversight & monitoring of CoC funded applicants through the Review Committee which uses a monitoring process (project eval tool, site visits, APR review) to ensure program performance and quality. Additional admin funds would enable MDHI Board to continue work on strategic planning initiatives to strengthen the CoC including Coordinating Committee's current focus on a Regional Plan of participation and inclusion and MDHI Board's work with Mayors & Gov's office to implement capacity building for MDHI to be poised for the new HEARTH requirements. MDHI, as Lead Agency, was already successful this year in outreach made to other Colorado CoC's to purchase new HMIS software for entire state.

Current HMIS software package is limited in reporting, sharing and user friendliness areas. HMIS Lead Organization has developed in-house crystal reporting for user agencies in order to complete Data Quality, APRs and AHAR. All data is exportable from the system. The process is difficult and time consuming, requiring sophisticated data analysis. However, HMIS staff has been provided with the training and software necessary to accomplish this task. MDHI is in the process of changing software vendors to ensure compliance with new data elements and reporting requirements. New software is to be in place January 2011 that will eliminate many of these challenges and/or barriers.

Agencies are provided with four monthly system-generated data quality reports by program: 1)Fix Master list of universal issues; 2)Data completeness/participation report[(bed capacity/(enrolled clients - overdue clients)]; 3)Duplicate Client report; and a 4)Current Program roster, which are reviewed by HMIS staff. HMIS staff contact agencies and provide technical assistance when; program completeness scores fall below 90%, duplicate clients exist, and when program participation rates fall below 90%. Monthly CoC-wide reports are created using the same procedure and reviewed by management staff.

All HMIS users must attend training prior to HMIS data entry. Specific attention is to issues of program entry and exit date criteria. This status is calculated when length of stay (system calculated as exit date minus entry date) is greater than a static number of program days allowed-assigned by HMIS staff and based on grant criteria (TH=730 days). We did not do a PIT in 2010, so we are left with the data we presented last year. As we stated in 2009, we utilized HMIS for the first time that January and ran into many challenges in the data analysis process which, among other things, limited our ability to compare results to previous years and even raised some questions as to accuracy of certain findings. Some numbers were useable and the increase in first time homelessness was a reflection of what was happening to the economy across the nation. Loss of job and then housing was the most frequent answer to 1st time homeless. We also had an increase in children due to the increase in the number of families losing jobs and then being evicted. We are looking forward to completing our 2011 PIT survey and, with our new HMIS software in place CoC wide in mid to late 2011, are hopeful we will be able to conduct annual PIT's to really enable the CoC to adjust strategic planning efforts around valid, usable data. We are hopeful with the slight improvement in the regional job market as well with the use of HPRP dollars, we will be able to show we stemmed the tide.

MDHI conducted the Point-in-Time count over a 24-hr period on 1-27-09. The methodology changed this year from prior years as we tried to capture the best estimate of the number of homeless persons in our 7 county metro area. Info from paper surveys collected from homeless by outreach volunteers and service providers was reviewed and entered into the Colorado HMIS and combined with info already in this data base from participating agencies that enter this data directly upon intake and exit. PIT survey forms were standardized to meet HMIS standards resulting in some changes to questions that had been asked in prior years. Inputting the paper surveys into our HMIS allowed for the assignment of a unique PIN which was used to eliminate duplicate counts. Sheltered population is based on responses to the survey question: Where did you spend last night? Respondents who indicated that they spent last night in ES, TH or motels paid for with vouchers were included in the sheltered count. Data entered directly into the HMIS system for persons residing in 30-120 day ES programs and in 2 year TH programs may have been entered prior to the count date. However, all persons still residing in those programs would be captured by the HMIS system. In addition, an EXCEL spreadsheet was created so that Domestic Violence Shelters could report aggregate information on clients served on 1-27-09 using the same data fields contained within the HMIS System.

The CoC's comprehensive demographic information was collected upon intake by agencies that serve the homeless throughout the seven counties and then entered into the HMIS system either by each agency or by the temporary data entry workers. Participating agencies included emergency shelters, day shelters, transitional housing facilities, soup kitchens, county departments of human services, workforce development programs, day labor programs, outreach programs, head start agencies, faith based organizations, mental health centers, food banks, and health care clinics. In addition, outreach teams conducted surveys with persons sleeping on the streets and other public places. The information from paper surveys was entered into HMIS and checked for duplication. We then used the HMIS information to determine the count of unsheltered.

Agency staff, volunteers, and outreach workers were instructed to complete only one survey for each homeless individual or family and the importance of obtaining the respondent's initials, age, birth month and gender. When the surveys were input into HMIS, a unique identification pin for each respondent was created using first initial, middle initial, first 3 letters of the last name, birth month, age & gender. A survey was classified as a duplicate if it met all three of the following conditions: the unique identifies matched exactly; the surveys were submitted by the same agency; the agency was located in an urban area where the caseload is often large enough that volunteers may have interviewed the same person more than once. For respondents where a variable was missing in the identifier, other variables were considered in determining duplication, including language, military service, ethnicity, race, and the city and county in which the respondent spent the night

Homeless service agencies throughout the CoC are focused on reducing the number of unsheltered homeless households with dependent children. Through the Coordinating Committee, information on services available throughout the metro wide area are shared with numerous participants/programs. Families identified through outreach efforts at various agencies are directed to the places or program able to help with the situation. The Colorado Coalition for the Homeless operates a family service center in downtown Denver to meet the emergency needs of homeless families. Referrals to family shelters are made until shelter beds are filled for the day. CCH staff then provides motel vouchers to families unable to access available emergency shelters. The Denver Department of Human Services provides additional motel vouchers to families. After 5 pm, families may obtain a motel voucher from the Samaritan House shelter. During severe weather several CoC participants open voucher and emergency shelter programs, several in conjunction with the faith based community. Many of our CoC participating agencies received HPRP grants and used them to expand outreach and placement efforts to reduce the length of time families spend in shelters or to keep them from going there in the first place, thereby reducing the number of unsheltered families.

The Denver Outreach Collaborative is a multi-agency collaborative conducting street outreach to homeless individuals. The Colorado Coalition for the Homeless is the lead agency. Outreach is provided on a coordinated basis 16 hours each day, seven days per week. The approach to outreach utilizes engagement and trust building that is critical to reach chronically homeless persons with disabilities. Homeless are sought out at known gathering places; behind identified buildings; under identified bridges; in identified vacant lots; in Wal-Mart parking lots; in identified areas of the malls; bus stations; and any other locations that might be shared or identified with outreach workers.

3A. Continuum of Care (CoC) Strategic Planning Objectives

Objective 1: Create new permanent housing beds for chronically homeless persons.

MDHI will continue to support housing providers and developers to target resources made available through the State DOH, CHFA, Community Development Offices of the 7 counties represented as well Denver's Road Home to access city funds, CDBG, HOME funds and LIHTC to develop new PH for chronically homeless individuals and families as well as utilizing the PHB this year to bring 14 more beds on line within 8 months. Bring on-line in the next 12 months 50 new PH units for homeless initially funded by 2008's SuperNOFA PHB which include 16 units set aside for Chronically Homeless and 34 for homeless and begin construction on another 50 (16 of which will be for Chronically Homeless) more funded through 2009's application. Continue work with Jurisdictional Housing Authorities to set aside new Section 8 vouchers annually for homeless people at or below 30% AMI and to also participate in developments by setting aside some of their vouchers for project basing.

Coord. Com. continue work with cities, counties, sponsors & providers of housing in CoC thru Regional Plan to maximize participation in old & new funding opportunities (HPRP, NSP) to develop new PH units for individuals and families. Continue work identifying opportunity zones for placement of affordable housing. Engage the faith based communities to increase efforts to sponsor homeless families and individuals with housing assistance. Work with private developers and non-profits to foster innovative design of PH in an effort to incorporate original and cost-saving designs. MDHI continue to educate the public about the need for PH in an effort to raise awareness and acceptance. Work with jurisdictional housing authorities to provide vouchers for those at or below 30% AMI. MDHI to facilitate tighter partnerships and linkages among service providers as well as solicit input and suggestions from homeless & overall community on the most effective strategies to address homelessness

Biannually review project APR's to assess progress towards movement of homeless persons from transitional housing to permanent housing. Continue to assist homeless individuals NOT eligible for public benefits to access mental health treatment, substance abuse treatment and medical care enabling persons to move to PH options. Work with partner agencies to access new funding sources through HPRP to assist in the move to PH by providing security deposit and rental assistance. Increase the participation in the Colorado Coalition for the Homeless/St. Francis Integrative health model to provide dental care, medical primary care, and mental health and substance abuse treatment services to 2,600 patients by end of 2010. Coordinating Committee has formed an Employment Sub-Committee to focus on developing employment opportunities for people who are homeless with an emphasis on jobs paying more than minimum wage and providing benefits. They are working to accomplish this by convening "sharing meetings" with workforce center staff from throughout the CoC with service providers and homeless to discuss the barriers to employment for this population and solutions we can all work together on to assure more employment success. Encourage expansion of employment programs already in existence with the hospitality industry and continue partnership with the State Division of Vocational Rehabilitation to connect homeless individuals with vocational rehabilitation services. MDHI CoC chose a project combining housing and employment to homeless with disabilities as its PHB recipient this year.

MDHI will continue to monitor APR's and share success CoC wide to encourage best practices. MDHI, through its many members, will keep alert for new funding sources for job training and education for the homeless. Will work with Veterans' organizations to assist in job development and placement. Build on relationships CoC members already have with state and county work programs. Work with CoC providers to assure primary parents have access to continuing education programs making them more valuable in the work place and setting an example for their kids.

Continue to educate CoC participant agencies on available funding sources through HPRP and other NOFA's to assist in the move to PH by providing security deposit and rental assistance. Monitoring of APR's to determine best practices and share among members. Work with community to develop more PH units and provide more housing vouchers to make PH options available. Encourage work being done by current organizations that provide the foundation and life skills needed for households success in moving from TH to PH options. Expand access to benefits to ensure financial resources to move to PH through such strategies as BART and SOAR. Fully develop job/employment program currently being worked on to allow PH retention.

Work with new funding sources to develop programs for people with poor credit histories and/or criminal backgrounds to qualify for housing (NSP). Continue to coordinate CoC participants in provision of funding to prevent evictions, foreclosure and utility shut-off(HPRP). Encourage CoC members to utilize Family Unification Program dollars (\$766,640 coming to CoC members in next year) to keep families together & in homes. Continue to monitor APR's to identify effective prevention programs and share with all CoC stakeholders. Work cross-jurisdictionally to increase coordination and collaboration between mainstream mental health resources, substance abuse resources and programs, mainstream health providers and nonprofit providers to ensure better utilization of health care resources ensuring households do not become homeless for reasons associated with these issues.

Foster Care (Youth Aging Out):

In 2004 House Bill 1107 created the Office of Homeless Youth Services now located within the Colorado Department of Human Services, Supportive Housing and Homeless Programs. The Office is responsible for examining discharge policies, protocols and processes for youth aging out of the foster care system and child welfare system. The Office of Homeless Youth Services works with the Executive Directors, or their designees, of the Departments of Corrections, Education, Health Care Policy and Financing, Human Services, Public Safety, Public Health and Environment, the Judicial Department, as well as, private nonprofit and not-for-profit organizations, appropriate federal departments and other key stakeholders in the community served by the MDHI CoC. The Office is responsible for developing and implementing recommendations on how to ensure that youth graduating from systems of care do not end up on the streets or shelters. The Homeless Youth Coordinator utilized an advisory body and completed a strategic plan. The key goals in this strategic plan were incorporated into a set of recommendations that were developed by the Colorado Community and Interagency Council on Homelessness, which were presented to Governor Bill Ritter in October of 2008 and a protocol was established incorporating many of these recommendations ensuring youth aren't discharged to homelessness. Non-profits in the CoC working with youth played an important part in the implementation of these recommendations.

Health Care:

Health care discharge policy is a coordinated effort among the Denver Department of Human Services, Denver Health and Hospitals, St. Joseph's Hospital, Porter Hospital and CoC homeless service providers including the Colorado Coalition for the Homeless, VOA, Samaritan House, Christ Bodies Ministries and the Denver Rescue Mission. The system includes 115 respite beds which accept referrals from Denver Health, Porter Hospital, St. Joseph's, Stout Street Clinic, and street outreach workers. Respite beds are available to homeless individuals upon hospital discharge and stayed 100% full in the last year.

Improvements to the system recently include new respite beds at Christ Bodies Ministries, funded by Denver's Road Home, Denver Rescue Mission, & VOA's Family Motel. Meetings with all Respite Providers occur on a regular basis. Currently Denver is working on a national demonstration project called Hospital to Home, where communities across the country are conference calling to share best practice models on how to work on coordinated discharge planning from hospitals in major urban cities.

Mental Health:

The State of Colorado has a discharge policy in place for the two state mental health institutes, which prevents and severely limits the institutes from discharging of persons to shelters. The two mental health institutes have 3 distinct populations whose discharge processes differ from one another.

1. The civil commitment group. These are subdivided into adult, adolescent and geriatric groups. They are admitted primarily through the state mental health statute governing the treatment of the severely mentally ill. The hospital by policy must arrange for both a safe setting and continuity of care.

2. Criminal commitments: NGRI(The Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity) patients can progress to community placement. This requires not only evidence of clinical results in reducing the patient's risk to the community, but also a consensus among treatment providers, prosecutors and courts. An NGRI patient can leave the hospital on an approved community placement only when the financial, physical and clinical resources have been secured. The scenarios can vary from a locked nursing home, to an apartment and job.

3. Criminal commitments: Competency and Sanity. The courts regularly send to the hospital accused individuals whose competency to stand trial or petition of insanity requires evaluation. The usual disposition of these patients is a return to the county jail.

Corrections:

The State of Colorado is actively working on developing discharge policies for correctional institutions including pre-release benefits acquisition as mandated by new legislation. A legislative task force which includes the Dept. of Corrections, mental health providers, juvenile corrections, state human services, parole and probation is working on this issue. In addition, the Governor's Interagency Homeless Council has recently completed a set of recommendations for Governor Ritter and the legislature that includes recommendations for discharge planning for this population. Recommendations were presented to Governor Bill Ritter in October of 2008 and some progress has been made on establishing a protocol. A CoC member organization is responsible for the creation of a 215 page "Re-Entry Guide" given out to those exiting prisons to better prepare them to address housing and employment issues. Through the work of the CoC's Employment Sub-Committee, regional employment & housing barrier issues for ex-offenders are being targeted and addressed. Resources lists for "ex-offender friendly" employers are constantly updated and disseminated to service providers. Programs through such agencies as the Denver OEO are being developed to provide vouchers with Case Management attached to provide housing for this population.

3C. Continuum of Care (CoC) Coordination

Through the Coordinating Committee, MDHI keeps track of HPRP allocations to the CoC area served and at least 21 of our CoC provider/sponsor members have utilized this funding from the Denver Metro as well as State HPRP allocations to provide services such as deposit and rent assistance to homeless moving into Permanent Housing or for prevention programs to assure households stay in current housing. Through work of this Committee, smaller agencies joined to establish a common phone number for community to access information and locations to go to for assistance. An outreach or community resource office at Colorado Coalition for the Homeless was established as another point of entry where families and individuals can be directed to point of service. About one half of the funding applied for will serve families and the remaining half will be used for individuals (men, women and youth).

Describe how the CoC is participating in or coordinating with any of the following: Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) initiative, HUD VASH, or other HUD managed American Reinvestment and Recovery Act programs (2500 character limit)?

The CO Department of Human Services, through a CoC funded program, works with HUD VASH to provide 100 beds to Vets in all CoC jurisdictions. Case managers in permanent and transitional housing settings work with formerly homeless striving for homeownership and utilized 1st time homebuyer programs being offered by State, counties & municipalities through the NSP programs in their jurisdictions resulting in 3 households exiting TH, PH and S+C programs to homeownership in last year. The MDHI CoC area received a total of almost \$8,450,000 in HPRP funds and almost \$2,900,000 in TANF funds to provide financial aid and stabilization services to over 2,200 households in our 7 county CoC area to date as well as using \$985,000 for HMIS improvements and some admin for entire state. These funds coming through direct HUD funding to municipalities, counties as well as to the State, were accessed by over 24 CoC member organizations. MDHI is encouraging members to work with their county and city jurisdictions to access NSP funds(1,2 &3)/properties for PH unit development as well as accessing some of the \$574,277 in HOME funds for production of PH that was recently awarded to Jefferson Co. The CoC encourages members to weigh in on the passage of a National Housing Trust Act that could potentially bring \$14-15 million to Colorado for the development of Permanent Housing units. MDHI is also working with member groups interested in the development of more beds for homeless vets through the PHB NOFA process. Our MDHI CoC community members continue work on identifying opportunity zones for the placement of affordable housing & encourages the faith based communities' efforts to sponsor homeless families and individuals with housing assistance. CoC continues efforts to educate the public about the need for permanent affordable housing in an effort to raise awareness and acceptance. We are working with jurisdictional housing authorities to make more regular and project based vouchers available for those at or below 30% AMI through additional HUD funding provided for more vouchers this past year. Boulder Housing Partners, a CoC member, will also be receiving \$763,572 to provide rental assistance for non-elderly disabled which will help folks obtain and stay in PH units.

If yes, please describe the established policies that are in currently in place.

CoC began instruction last year for members to better understand the educational assurance mandated by the HEARTH Act. The homeless school liaisons for each of our jurisdictional areas were identified and the information shared throughout the CoC. These individuals were asked to attend both our Coordinating Committee as well as Board meetings to detail how they work in the schools and to identify ways in which provides can work with the liaisons to assure that the rights of these children for educational services. Members were instructed to make the continued school participation of homeless children a major focus of their case management plans and it will need to be covered in the renewal applications for continued funding.

Describe the CoC's efforts to collaborate with local education agencies to assist in the identification of homeless families and inform them of their eligibility for McKinney-Vento education services. (limit 1500 characters)

Working with the State Department of Education, CoC providers have been educated on the steps needed to be taken by each jurisdiction to identify homeless children in their areas. Flyers have been developed in both English and Spanish to inform project/program participants of the educational rights of homeless children and youth. These are in the hands of agency Intake counselors, Case Managers, school counselors, and Outreach personnel and are given to families. Outreach already made to schools regarding PIT count Jan 2011 and how we can work together to get much more accurate numbers for this population.

Describe how the CoC has, and will continue, to consider the educational needs of children when families are placed in emergency or transitional shelter. (limit 1500 characters)

When families with children are admitted to programs and projects, or seen on outreach, education placement for the children is considered to try and make sure kids are able to continue in current school setting if desired, or in the local school where they are accessing resources. If a child is placed in a new school setting while in a shelter or TH program, efforts are made to provide permanent housing within same school boundaries if desired by family. Transportation to and from school is provided by bus tokens, cab vouchers, or gas for family vehicles. Program and shelter staff work with local schools on identifying the needs of these children (clothing, coats, school supplies, transportation, etc) and coordinate efforts to keep the kids in school.

Describe the CoC's current efforts to combat homelessness among veterans. Narrative should identify organizations that are currently serving this population, how this effort is consistent with CoC strategic plan goals, and how the CoC plans to address this issue in the future.(limit 1500 characters)

DHS currently uses V-Bash vouchers and MDHI leadership is working with CoC members in the Aurora area to develop more PH beds for Veterans as the new VA Regional hospital is being built there. Through collaboration with the VA, CoC providers were able to assist 56 Veterans obtain VA benefits and another 90 get VA Health care. A CoC funded program, St. Joseph's Home, concentrates on providing housing and case management for veterans, using older vets to mentor younger vets on returning to productivity and remaining in housing. CoC providers have also recently used HPRP funds to assist some vets in remaining in housing by assisting with utility, rent and deposit payments. Outreach workers with Colorado Coalition for the Homeless and other agencies identify veterans in the homeless they contact and refer them to case managers able to assist with getting access to benefits. Several of the CoC funded groups are in contact with the VA on a regular basis to encourage referrals to the various programs. Our PIT in 2011 will also try to better identify the true number of homeless vets in our CoC area.

3D. Hold Harmless Need (HHN) Reallocation

Instructions:

Continuum of Care (CoC) Hold Harmless Need (HHN) Reallocation is a process whereby an eligible CoC may reallocate funds in whole or in part from SHP renewal projects to create one or more new permanent housing projects and/or a new dedicated HMIS project. We are falling short on our increase percentage of homeless persons employed at exit to at least 30% although we do meet HUD's required %. The national and local recession has added additional barriers to employment for the homeless households on whose behalf we work. Our 2009 PIT showed that over 44% of homeless counted reported being so for the 1st time identifying inability to pay rent/mortgage & loss of jobs as the most prevalent issues leading to them being homeless. We were hard pressed as a community to provide shelter and services to the large increase in homelessness this recession caused. The overall unemployment rate in our area limited even further the ability of homeless to obtain employment. We are working as a CoC to develop more partnerships with employers in the service & lodging industries to employ homeless and awarded our PHB to a program this year that incorporates housing and employment. One of our CoC members, Bayuad Industries, has even started up companies of its own to go after contracts with government agencies and fill those positions with homeless they work with. We will continue to develop more partnerships through the work of our Coordinating Committee's sub-committee on employment.

Number of Chronic Homeless increased due to 2009 PIT methodology used which was different than in prior years. We also question the validity of the number produced by the study due to discrepancies in the way disability was counted, a component of the chronic definition. We worked with various agencies doing quarterly counts of the homeless population but look forward to the January 2011 PIT to more accurately count the homeless in our CoC.

The Coordination Committee of MDHI also meets monthly and has participants from all counties in the CoC. This Committee coordinates the Regional Jurisdiction Conference annually (April 2, 2010) that brings County Commissioners, City Council members, Mayors, City Officials, Police, members of the Governor's office, service providers, faith based groups and non-profits, as well as homeless and formerly homeless together to discuss barriers to housing, employment, benefit procurement, transportation to work sites and service sites, cold weather planning, etc.
